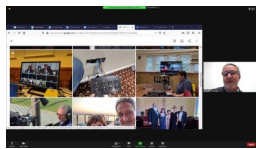


2/5/2021 We welcomed back former member and past president Doug Smith as our lunch speaker. Doug is the managing partner of his firm, Axiom CPA's.

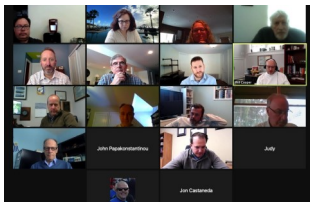
2/12/2021 –Our speaker at our meeting this week was Robert Bullington. Rob does audio/visual productions for a wide variety of organizations and individuals.

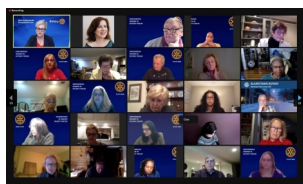
