

Kristen McCauley, The Stickley Museum at Craftsman Farm



6/10/2022 –We welcomed as our speaker on Friday, Kristen McCauley, Senior Manager of Education and Interpretation at The Stickley Museum at Craftsman Farms.

Kristen spoke about the life and career of Gustav Stickley, who was a big part of the Arts and Crafts design school in the early part of the 20th century. Stickley worked mainly in

designing furniture but his design influence was felt far beyond that. He created Craftsman Farms as a place to work, teach and find peace. The property passed through to another family during the mid- 20th century until a museum was started in the 1980's to preserve his work and story.

The farm is open for tours of the main house and grounds, for those interested. It is located in Parsippany, NJ. Thanks to Kristen for visiting our club and giving an interesting presentation.
