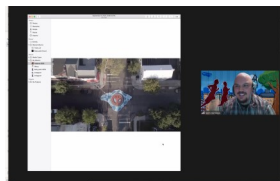
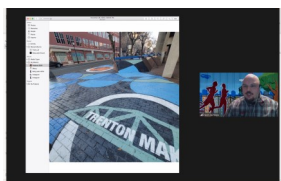
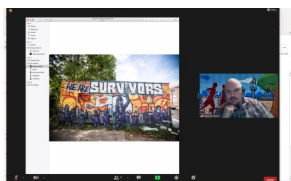
Leon Rainbow



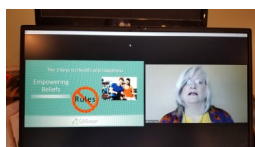

Martin Luther King Day 2021



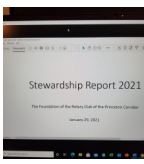
